An Invitation to ISA Members From Debbie Wardley and Ansett Airlines...1985 Proposed Convention Site: Sydney, Australia

At our annual meeting in May, we received a most gracious invitation to visit Australia for our May '85 convention. We asked Debbie to provide us with the details so our members could vote on the proposed site.

(Normally, future convention sites are selected/voted on at each yearly meeting, but since this location is quite a bit more removed from previous ones -- Las Vegas, Miami, Denver, Cancun, Jamaica, Toronto, Seattle -- we felt it only fair to allow each member to have a vote.)

"I feel the dates of May 7, 8, 9 and 10 would be most suitable. This will provide a four-day convention which would be more suitable in view of the distance that most members will have to travel. A minimum commitment in terms of days for a member travelling from say LAX would be 8 days. The travel time from LAX to Sydney is approximately 15 hours. Although it is possible to do this in one day I have allowed 2 days travel each way so that members can recover.

Ansett management has agreed to negotiate with Pan Am, Continental, Air New Zealand and Qantas in order to secure sub-load positive travel (ed. note: I queried Debbie as to the meaning of "sub-load positive" since the two terms in the US are used as opposites; her reply is printed near the end of her comments).

The venue would be Sydney with discount accommodations, possibly being organized with the Sydney Hilton which is located in the centre of the city. Sydney provides many attractions including the Opera House, Harbour Bridge, Ferry Boats and the historical "Rocks" which is a collection of buildings, shops and restaurants restored from the days when the convicts first landed in Australia.

...to give you an idea of how the conference would run:

7th May -- Cocktail Party, Hosted by Ansett

8th May -- ISA Meeting. Lunch served during the meeting so as to

avoid the meeting having to finish by a set time.

9th May -- Mornings: Discussion Groups

Lunch: Hosted by Ansett or A.F.A.P (Australian

Federation of Airline Pilots? Ed.)

Evenings: Harbour cruise dinner party. This would involve chartering a ferry for our group only which would be dinner and music on board whilst cruising Sydney harbour.

10th May -- Visit to the Opera House and The Rocks.

-- Watsons Bay (Lunch) -- This is a very inexpensive and famous open air, seaside fish restaurant of Sydney.

-- Afternoon free.

You will appreciate that by organizing dinner on Day 3, Lunch on Days 2, 3 and 4 this this will enable the ISA group to do most things together rather than separating into small groups for meals.

The Ansett marketing department is currently investigating various hotels in Sydney for the best possible room rates. Ansett is aware of our criteria for a hospitality suite as well as a conference room for our meeting and these will both be provided for. The luncheon on Day 3 will also be at the hotel. I am still to organize a sponsor for the Opera House and Rocks tour but I cannot see this as a problem.

As to your question about Sub-Load travel: Members attending would have to travel from either LAX or SFO to Sydney. Many carriers operate these route and from past experience May is not a heavily booked time of the year so members on discount fares should have no problem securing space on an aircraft. Most flights from the USA go through HNL and arrive in Sydney at 8:30 am. This would give members the option of arriving on either the 6th or 7th of May or earlier if they choose to do so. The flight from HNL to SYD is about 9 1/2 hours."

Sounds like a very exciting proposal! I hope each of your will consider it carefully and vote your preference on the enclosed ballot. For simplicity sake, we've included it with your renewal form. The deadline for renewals is December 31st. Please help us get the new roster out early by sending in your renewal NOW, before you forget.

A couple of things to keep in mind when voting on Australia: Time required is a minimum of 8 days. A normal 75% ID fare is \$600 roundtrip (that's 1/4 of the \$2398 regular coach fare), unless and if Qantas is offering their \$200 special airline employee rate (assuming your airline has an agreement with them).

ELECTION NOMINATIONS: Once again, it's time to open the nominations for the offices of President, Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer. Term runs from May 1984 through May 1986. Since we do not have any formal rules regarding the nominating procedure, the following suggestions have been discussed by the present officers and will serve as guidelines for our upcoming elections.

A. Any ISA member in good standing is eligible to run for any office, whether or not they have previously held office.

B. Sign your nomination, send it to the person you have nominated and have **them** sign it, and return it to Jean Harper, who's agreed to coalate the results. Remember, you must get the written approval of the nominee for your nomination to be valid.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL FOR 1984: It's time again to renew your membership (and ISA's treasury). The fee is \$20 for members who are currently working and \$5 for furlougees and other disenfranchised members (need I say more?) If your status changes during the membership year from furloughed (or whatever) to working, we'd sure appreciate your sending us the extra \$15. It's not mandatory, but

since we are so small, every \$ helps. The new roster will be compiled in January. We want to include EVERYONE, so please mail your renewal now so we won't have to waste our precious ISA dollars to send you a second notice. In honor of being the very first member to renew, we award Denise Blankinship the dubious title of "Numera Una"! Thanks, Denise and our special appreciation to you for introducing ISA to Nancy Moye, Piedmont S/O. Welcome to ISA, Nancy! We'll look forward to meeting you in Seattle next May. Now, back to those renewals...just make your check payable to "ISA+21", complete the enclosed renewal form, fold your check inside, seal and mail (it's pre-addressed).

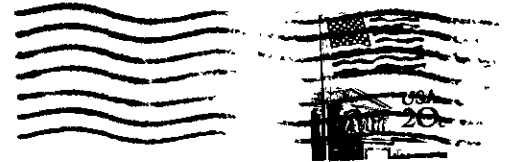
