I am researching the organizational structure of several other professional oraginzations that are the same size as ISA and comparing how they handle the division of duties for a group that has the potential 10 increase membeship substantially more. One item that I did find is that the Chairperson Acting Chairpeison Secretary and Treasurer have to be elected to those positions and amust be distinguished from the other directors selected. 


FINANCE REPORT Laura Cox

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Sexual harassment seems to be the buzz word of the 90's Since Anita Hill courageously stood up to the establishment and shed light into one of the corners of Pandora's Box, the subject has not been laid to rest. It should not as long as there is truth and substance in the flow of allegations from women Our very own newsletter has published an article on sexual harassment in the last two issues, (two excellent articles). My intent here is not to write about sexual harassment I only want to inform you about a study on sexual harassment in corporate, regional and major airlines that we, ISA members, are asked to participate in Eileen has an interesting background A writer, analyst, and commercial pilot, she has unwittingly stumbled on the fact that there is a lack of statistics on women pilots who have experienced sexual harassment in the cockpit, on layovers, on the flight line, in flight ops. etc. Not one to shrug her shoulders and go on. Eileen has taken it upon herself to fill that void. Let me quote parts of her letter

".. have the respondents submit a narrative description of any sexual harassment they experienced. The data can be coded later for study into various field groups....It would help if the women would include their names, addresses, phone numbers, and airline affiliations so that I can verify the information.

After I have talked with the respondents, I will enter the information into my computer. I can copy the anonymity method used at A.S.R.S. After the report is received, all identifying information is deleted. That way, if the report is used later by researchers, the respondent won't be known.

I am in the process of researching this topic and have found only three usable sexual harassment in the cockpit incidents in the A.S.R.S. database. I know this has happened more than three times. However, nothing serious will get done about this situation unless these incidents can be documented. So let's do something about this problem. It's up to us to solve this. Please ask the ISA women to send their sexual harassment incidents to: P.O. Box 641322, San Jose. CA 95164-1322"

HISTORIAN AND SPEAKERS BANK

As Historian and Speakers Bank person, one actually wears one hat with two brims, as opposed to wearing two hats. The ISA historian is handed down a box of newsletters, newspaper articles, magazines, magazine articles and pictures of ISA members and receives periodic additions. 




SUMMER GET-TOGTHER



Captain Ori Criffith received her Private Pilot Rating when she was 18, and attended Indiana State University on a Talent Grant Scholarship in their aviation program. She began in 1979 and in two years finished a four year degree with a double major in Aviation Administration and Professional Flight Lori has the following ratings. ATP. ME. SES. Rotocraft. Glider. CFI, CFI-SES. CFII, and MEI

Immediately following college she was hired by a company in Kentucky where

she flew pipe line patrol of oil and gas lines. In August of 1981, she was hired by Atlantis Airlines, a commuter in the southeast Because she was so young, she could not receive her ATP until her 23rd birthday on December 29. 1983 A captain's position came available in early December of that year and both the Chief Pilot and Training Officer flew the line for her to hold the slot until her birthday On that day. she was the voungest female Captain in the industry

Piedmont Airlines was Lori's first choice and they hired her in March,

1984, as flight engineer on the Boeing 727. She was on the panel for a year before upgrading to the right seat. On April 15, 1987 Lon became the youngest passenger-carrying captain in the world when she upgraded to captain on a Fokker F-28 with Piedmont Airlines. She was 26 years old.

Today. Lori is a Boeing 737 captain with USAir. She is a member of the

International Whirly-Girls, the Wings Club, and the Ninety-Nines. She is also a past Executive Council member of ISA as well as our Master Seniority List Chairperson and Museum Exhibit Coordinator

From the day that Lori became a member of ISA, she has been one of our most active and energetic members. Would that all of us did just 10 % of what Lori does, and this organization would be tremendous. In 1986 in San Diego, Lori took on her first assignment as one of the


