ISA+21 awards a minimum of two Scholarships of \$5000 each year to aspiring female airline pilots, to be used towards an advanced flight training program.

Prerequisite Information

Applicants must satisfy all of the following requirements:

- Currently be enrolled in an advanced flight training program; or
- Have completed ab-initio flight training
- In pursuit of a career as an airline pilot
- Hold a current first class aviation medical certificate

Conditions:

- ◆ Only one Financial Scholarship Award is allowed in a lifetime
- Applicants may apply as many times as they wish
- Scholarship funds to be used towards an advanced flight training program
- Funds will be paid directly to the approved flight training organisation
- The winner is responsible for travel, housing and personal expenses during training
- ◆ Training must be completed within the following twelve months
- Open to female applicants, as indicated on their pilot certificate

Process:

- All applications will be assessed by the Scholarship Committee for eligibility
- Scholarship entries are due by November 1st each year
- The scholarship winners are announced in March of each year

- 10. Details pertinent to letters of inquiry from FAA (or equivalent agency) regarding any aircraft incidents. Or select None
